8:00 - 10:00 AM CLASS I - LIENS & PAYMENT BOND CLAIMS: A PRACTICAL OVERVIEW

Liens and payment bonds provide important security for subcontractors seeking to enforce their right to payment. Importantly, Florida law imposes a number of technical requirements in connection with lien and payment bond claims. In that regard, the Florida Statutes are strictly construed against contractors and subs who fail to satisfy the various technical requirements. What may seem like minor mistakes often lead to lien or payment bond rights being lost. This program will provide an overview of the technical requirements for lien and payment bond claims (such as required notices and calculating the amount of the lien), various types of payment bonds, common defenses and strategies for avoiding defenses. - Notice requirements for payment bond claims
- Calculating the amount of lien and payment bond claims
- Fraudulent lien/payment bond claim defense and other defenses
- Releases of Lien
- Litigation considerations

CLASS III - CLAIMS PRESERVATION: TOP MISTAKES IN PRESERVATION AND PRESENTATION

Claims for additional costs incurred on construction projects are a common and important issue for subcontractors. Taking proactive steps to preserve claims for additional costs is critical to their viability or strength. Contractors and subcontractors who do not take various steps to preserve their claims for additional costs often find out too late that they have not been preserved or are week. This class will cover important mistakes that should be avoided in order to preserve your claims. Topics to be covered:
