

1. Preconstruction

- a) Review plans and specs and send RFI's prior to bidding
- b) Ensure the required details are included on the plans or in the specs or both
- c) Make sure the specified system is approved in your jurisdiction

2. Contracts

- a) Make an effort to remove or mitigate indemnification clauses
- b) Include a very specific Scope of Work as an Exhibit or Addendum to the contract
- c) Specifically exclude things you don't want to be responsible for (sealants, house wraps, etc)
- d) If you use sub-subs, pass along any indemnification clause to which you've agreed to them and give them your Scope of Work.

3. Review

a) Inspect each phase of the work that comes prior to plastering: framing, masonry, concrete, windows, house wrap.

4. Educate

a) Your Crew Leaders, The GC's Project Manager, and the subs before you and after you. Teach them what you need for prior subs to do so that you can perform properly and ask post - what they need for you to do before they start





5. Performing

- a) Avoid the two-headed axe: Manufacturer's instructions vs Code/ Standard requirements
- b) Do the little things right!

Caulk Joints • Lath Laps • Fastener Spacing • Tie CJs • Fill cornerbeads • Miter accessory joints • Provide Drainage in concealed barrier systems • Prep solid bases • Transitions – dissimilar materials/systems
